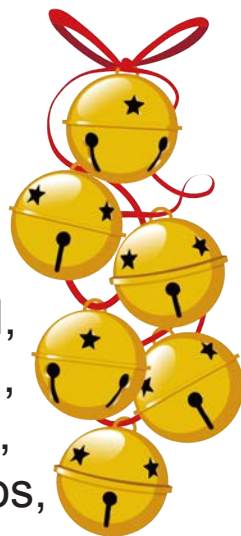

Our beloved Elaine Beckman Lynch (Elaine Biggs), MMYB's original costume designer, created the impressive array of international costumes for this production. To ensure their historical accuracy, Elaine thoroughly researched the cultural and design elements particular to each piece and then searched for complementary fabric. Her painstaking efforts to include each and every detail and embellishment produced an awe-inspiring collection not often seen in productions of the Nutcracker.

The Miller Marley Youth Ballet Company feels so fortunate to have had a designer of Elaine's expertise at the helm. Elaine's talents and friendship will be missed by many.

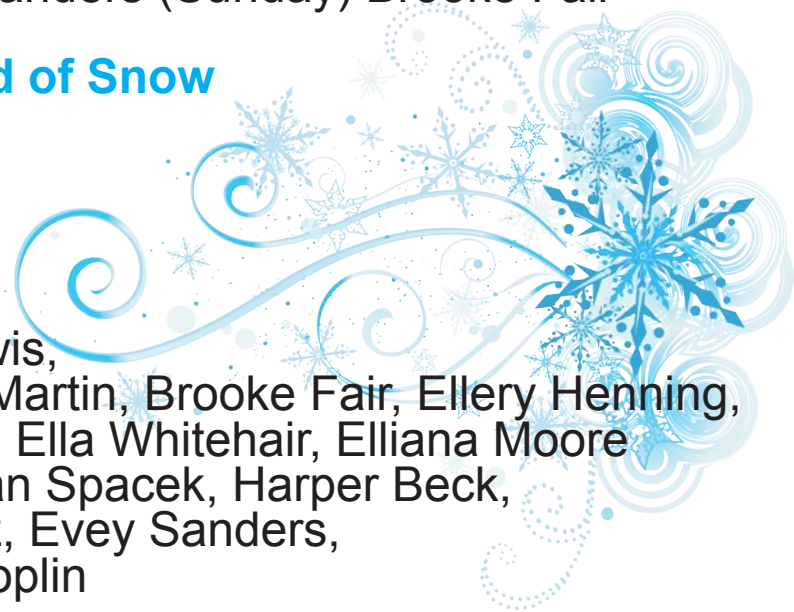

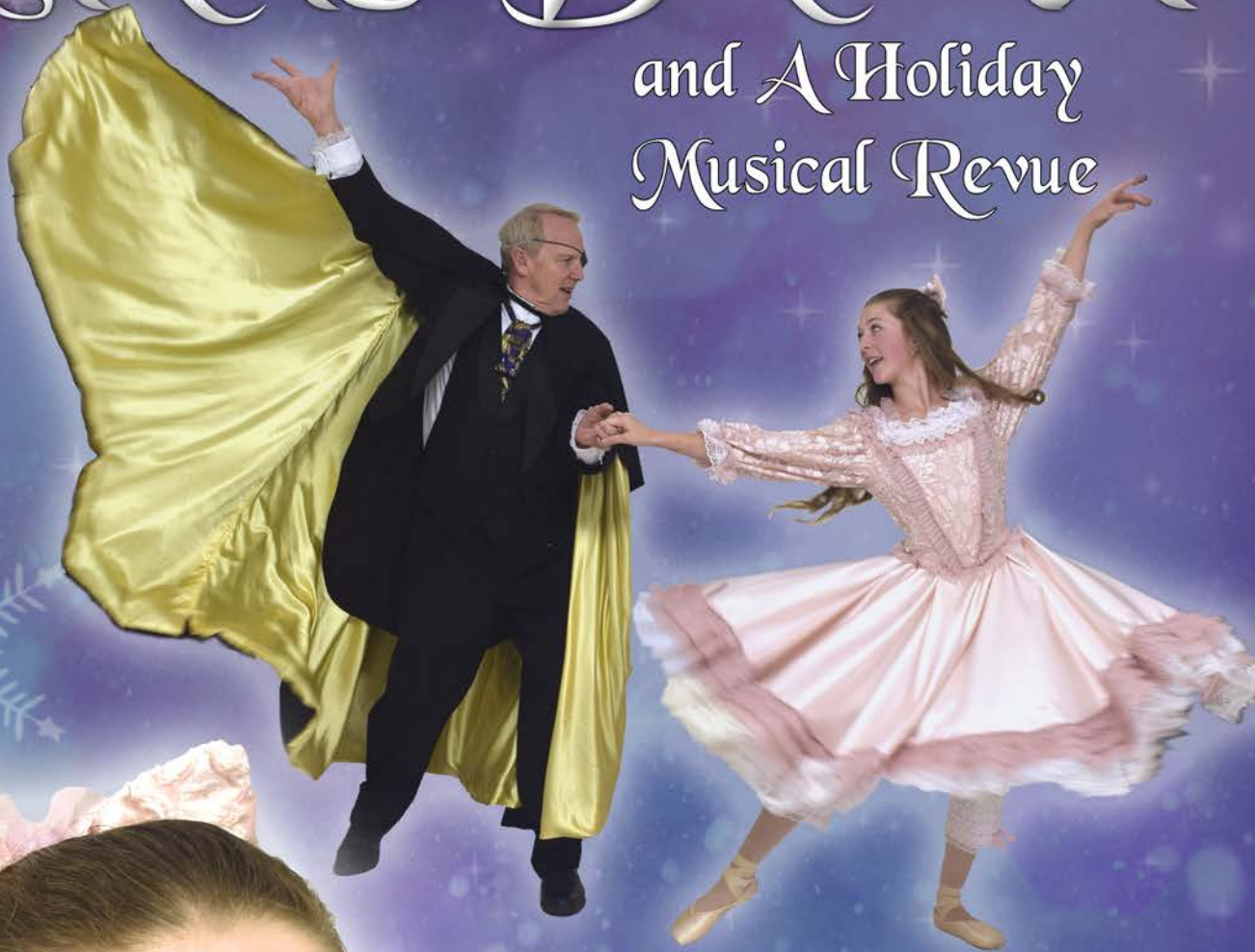
